ROAD TO THE REFORMATION

Martin Luther's Early Life

Martin Luther's father owned a copper mine in nearby Mansfeld. Having risen from the peasantry, his father was determined to see his son ascend to civil service and bring further honor to the family. To that end, Hans sent young Martin to schools in Mansfeld, Magdeburg and Eisenach. At the age of seventeen in 1501 he entered the University of Erfurt. The young student received his Bachelor's degree after just one year in 1502! Three years later, in 1505, he received a Master's degree. According to his father's wishes, Martin enrolled in the law school of that university. All that changed during a thunderstorm in the summer of 1505. A lightning bolt struck near to him as he was returning to school. Terrified, he cried out, "Help, St. Anne! I'll become a monk!" Spared of his life, but regretting his words, Luther kept his bargain, dropped out of law school and entered the monastery there.

During the time Luther was preparing to become a priest, he traveled to Rome. It was in Rome that he began to see things going on in the Roman Catholic church that disappointed him greatly. He transferred from the monastery in Erfurt to the one in Wittenberg, where after receiving his doctor of theology degree, he became a professor of biblical theology at the new University of Wittenberg. **It was here that the Reformation truly began.**

Luther was very keen on music. An accomplished Lute player, he composed countless hymns and he is regarded as one of the most important German composers prior to Bach.

Wittenberg: an artists' colony

Wittenberg, where Luther lived for much of his life, was a tiny town in the Germany of that period. And yet Luther found himself living only a few doors away from two of the greatest German painters of the day, Lucius Cranach and his son. The Cranachs are responsible for the series of striking portraits of Luther that still survive.

The dawn of a new faith

With his translation of the Bible into German Martin Luther attained permanent fame as far as a unification of the German language was concerned. Today some 70 million believers on all five continents are members of the Lutheran Church.



What is Lent? Lent is a season of the church year that lasts for 40 days (not counting Sundays) recalling Jesus' 40-day fast in the wilderness. As Lutherans, the time is full of prayer, service and self-examination. Some choose to live more simply or some other spiritual discipline to follow throughout the season. The season begins with Ash Wednesday, a day when we confess our sins and are marked on the forehead with a cross of dust and the words, "Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

A Word from Pastor Jones:

Individual Confession offered during Lent

I will be offering Individual Confession and Forgiveness during the Lenten season. This form of confession is basically a prayer of confession, which may or may not include an accounting of specific sins and pardons.

Confession consists of two parts. One is that we confess our sins. The other is that we receive absolution or forgiveness from the confessor as from God himself, by no means doubting but firmly believing that our sins are thereby forgiven before God in heaven."

Small Catechism

Luther intended confession and absolution especially for those who were about to receive Holy Communion and the Lutheran Church, as a whole, has maintained that connection.
